Understanding the communication of children and young people with social communication needs (including autism) is essential if they are to develop friendships and progress in school.

It is designed for those supporting individuals who are already using spoken language but need help to develop their communication skills further.

The course workbook is full of strategies and activities that can be used in all environments, at home, and at school.

The aims are

- To share information about typical communication development.
- To learn about the specific communication challenges children and young people with social communication needs face.
- To give practical ideas to help them learn to listen, understand, talk and interact.
- To help you develop their social understanding so that they find school easier.
- To share ideas with other parents and carers.

Topics covered

- Understanding what's happening when we talk to each other.
- Improving interaction in children and young people with social communication needs.
- Exploring how to use visual and physical structure effectively.
- Improving listening and understanding.
- Learning how to ask appropriate questions and share books together.
- Developing conversation skills.
- Interpreting unwanted behaviour as communicative.
